- 5. Brush
- 6. Inch tape

IV. Instructions to Students:

- 1. Punctuality and discipline should be maintained by the students at all times.

- 8. Students should bring their gross anatomy and histology manuals daily to respective labs.
- 9. Each student must bring along the following essential items for personal protection:

DRESS CODE FOR STUDENTS
